



An overview of Salt Lake City International Airport (SLC)

- AeroMexico, America West, America West Express, American, Atlantic Southeast, Comair, Continental, Continental Express, Delta, Frontier, JetBlue, Northwest, Salmon Air, SkyWest, Southwest and United Airlines serve Salt Lake City International Airport. - It is Delta Air Lines' third largest hub. Along with commuter partners, SkyWest, Comair and Atlantic Southeast, they operate 314 scheduled daily departures.
- The airport is situated within a two and a half-hour flight from half of the United State's population.
- Serving 18.5 million passengers in 2003, the facility is ranked 26th busiest in the United States and 49th busiest in the world.
- There are 808 scheduled daily flights from the facility serving 74 cities with non-stop flights.
- 36,550 daily airplane seats are available through SLC.
- The modern, convenient airport complex is made up of two terminals, five concourses and 79 gates.
- The International Snow Symposium recognized Salt Lake City International Airport with a first place award for excellence in snow and ice control during the winter of 2003.
- Language Line, a language translation service, is installed throughout the airport via the telephone system. It enables on-the-spot translation of 250 languages.
- U.S. Customs operates "on demand" inspecting cargo and charter flights.
- Within 60 miles of 11 world-class ski resorts.
- Convenient access to five national and 46 state parks.
- Host of the Olympic Winter Games of 2002.
- Gateway to 100 golf courses statewide, 24 in Salt Lake County and 25 more within an hour's drive. Alpine courses in the nearby Wasatch Mountains are world famous. Wingpointe Golf Course, an 18-hole course set into the natural environment, is conveniently located adjacent to Salt Lake City International Airport.
